Read To Your Children:

PLEASE MAKE A COMMITMENT TO READ ALOUD TO YOUR CHILD(REN). What you read can be anything from an interesting article in the newspaper, to a chapter from a novel, to a picture book, or a poem. Vary your read aloud pieces. Why should we read aloud every day???

- It involves children in reading for pleasure.
- It demonstrates reading for a purpose.
- It develops a sense of story.
- It develops knowledge of written language.
- It develops knowledge of how texts are structured.
- It improves and increases vocabulary.
- It creates a community of learners.
- It promotes oral language development.



Make a promise to yourself and don't forget! It's too important! Read your favorites or find a book about an interest your child has outside of school. BE SURE THAT YOUR CHILD KNOWS THAT READING IS VERY IMPORTANT!

Note from the Nurse:
